Garry Winogrand:

Garry Winogrand was a famous twentieth century photographer. He primarily photographed New York life, but also photographed American culture. He is best known for his street photography. He had a large range of subjects, from politicians to hippies to stay at home moms to business women. The everyday person was his inspiration. Winogrand preferred capturing images than developing them and sharing his pictures with others. A large majority of Winogrand's negatives were never developed. He never saw a third of the thousands of photos he took. Winogrand died at the age of fifty six. After his death, many of his images were printed and became famous.

Andreas Gursky is a German photographer. His work became famous in the early 1980s. Gursky is best known for his photographs of landscape and architecture. He was one of the first photographers to capture these images in color film. Gursky's work is conducted of a vast area on a large surface, meaning that the majority of his photos are gigantic prints. He is often attributed to have captured the effect globalization had on capitalism and everyday life.

Additionally, Andreas Gursky is known for his photograph that was the highest auctioned off photo in history, which was finally sold for four million dollars. Gursky is still alive and resides in Dusseldorf.
