Curatorial Rationale

Hidden things in us is what I tried to show in my art. When I started thinking and looking at all the paintings I did in IB art I remembered that I wanted to challenge myself. One challenge I think all of us have is not showing our hidden sides, and not seeing past how things look. These pieces are meant to hang and be viewed as if you are reading left to right.

Starting from the left. One hidden thing we all have is some little innocence left from being little kids. I wanted to show that with Curiosity consumes Innocence. The bright flower with the dark lines was inspired by my study of impressionism in particular Claude Monet's Water Lillies. I used dark lines to show how a dark world is curious to innocence but the bright pink flower needs to stand and not give in to it. Autuum bliss is also inspired by Claude Monet's landscapes. With the theme of seeing past how things look I experimented with the perspective in Autuum Bliss. How it is like you are seeing up through the leaves to the sky telling people to see different and the sky is sheltering you. The dark lines in the sky also represent the feeling of an impure world.

An impure world is shown most in the third painting. The death of you. Inspired by renaissance motifs of how death happens to us all I wanted to show how personal choice helps that along. We all must make choices about how we live if we let the darkness creep into our lives or live in purity. Like my impressionistic style I took it further by putting it in modern day and using a brand of chewing tobacco that is popular. The circle bands that tie the tabacoo to the mouth of the skulls are meant to show the inevitability of the choice to smoke. The background shows a smoker's lung so I attempt to combine both an old motif with modern science.

The two center paintings are very close to me and represent my feelings about my country and my religion. The two things that help innocence thrive in a dark world. For most people the flag and the cross are just symbols and they don't mean anything so I tried to make the viewer see how I and many other people see them.
