





Polishing & Buffing the Photographic Plate





Sensitizing the Photographic Plate The polished plate is sensitized by exposing it to iodine and bromine fumes



The sensitized plate is inserted into a light-proof holder with a protective slide placed inside the camera








4. Taking the likeness The subject is place in front of the camera 5. Developing the Image The image is "brought out" by suspending the photographic plate over a dish of mercury inside a fuming box. The photographic image is made permanent by bathing the photographic plate in hyposulphate of soda
