- 3. What are the feelings you associate with the memory?
- 4. Why is this memory important to you?
- 5. Who else finds this photo important (if any) and why?

How to Submit this:

I would prefer that if you are using a print that you photograph it with your phone or digitally scan it and use a digital file for this assignment. Otherwise, if the image is already in digital format, you are ready to go.

Please title the document: "Phind-A-Photo" and be sure your name is on it.

You can submit this one of two ways:

- You can type and print out your document and turn it into the "OTHER" tray for your period. You may
 also handwrite your answers if your writing is very legible. The photo must be embedded in the digital
 document or attached in some way to your paper. YOU MUST PRINT THIS YOURSELF either on your own
 printer or you can go to the library to print.
